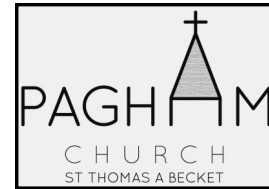

Letter from The Vicar

There has been some method, as regular readers might detect: having offered afresh weddings and funerals in the last two months we end up with baptisms to fit in with the Babe of Bethlehem. Yes, dear brothers and sisters, your parish church is very much available for the baptism or christening of your children!

That's an important place to start actually. These two words of baptism and christening are one and the same thing or, as a new Church of England website phrases it, "at a christening your child will be baptized" (the website is churchofenglandchristenings.org).

I am delighted that we get quite a nice number of christenings through the year, but there is room for more and perhaps it is something others of you might want to consider?

In a similar way to weddings and funerals you really don't have to be a frequent worshipper, although you are very welcome to be. We can arrange christenings on Sundays either during our main 9.45am service or at 12noon as a stand-alone baptism (sometimes with another family, which can make it more of a celebration and remind us that the Church is a social institution). Godparents are very special people, but they do need to have been christened themselves. If they haven't been, they may want to consider exploring that step of faith with their local church.

That reminds us that if you were not

baptized as a baby or young child you can still be as an 18- or 80-year-old. For, in essence, being christened is God calling you by name as one of His beloved children and inviting you into a growing relationship with Him, with His Church and indeed with yourself, knowing more of the mystery, depths and possibilities of your own being.

This free amazing gift of God's sets us off on such a journey, which none of us can ever really know fully. I am reminded that I was baptized in March 1980 with loving parents and godparents, but then a childhood without much more knowledge of God, Jesus, the Church. I eventually wanted to explore further and ended up being confirmed in 2003 and ordained in 2008: fruits which mysteriously came from that event in 1980 (and no doubt from people's prayers). It is never too early or too late to respond to God's love for us in Jesus Christ.

Once again, this Christmas, we see that love made visible in the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem: God becoming like us that we might become more like Him. Each human being's life is infinitely precious as all new parents know, so we want to thank God for this gift of a child with which He has blessed us. Christening or baptism can be that natural response of ours and so begins a new human being's journey into the life of God: a great adventure and sign of hope to a family, a community and the world.

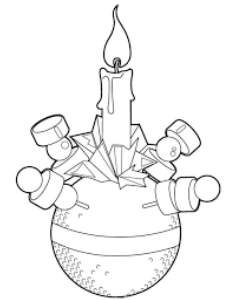
