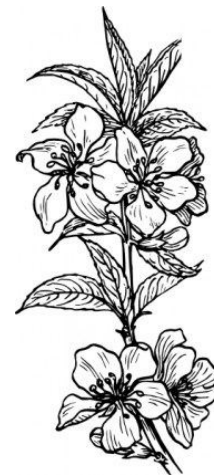

Letter from The Vicar

Happy holidays! As this leaflet is pushed through your letter-box by our kind volunteers, I will be in the Outer Hebrides: is parish life that bad, I hear you say, that the vicar needs to escape that far?! No, indeed, but as great a gift as rewarding work is, so also is rest and recreation. I call to mind this line from Isaiah:

'In returning and rest you shall be saved; in quietness and in trust shall be your strength' (Isaiah 30: 15).

So, I hope many of you will be enjoying your own variation on the theme of rest (or have done already or will be soon, to avoid the likes of us during the busy school holidays!)

Many of us, I think, enjoy our rest through reading. I have just finished the first volume of a rather long book on St Paul by N.T. Wright (formerly Bishop of Durham), although volume two is frustratingly longer, so I may not want to weigh down the Skye to Hebrides ferry! A couple of years ago I really enjoyed reading C.S. Lewis' Chronicles of Narnia, so may try his science-fiction trilogy. If I wanted a real busman's holiday I could simply turn again to God's Word in the Bible, not your usual holiday-read, but maybe there is more than meets the eye... Think about it: action, adventure, war, intrigue; am I talking about Hilary Mantel or some other historical novelist? I am not; turn in the Bible to books such as Judges, 1 and 2 Samuel, 1 and 2 Kings where you will find

Gideon, Samson and Delilah, Saul, Jonathan, David and Bathsheba, Elijah and Jezebel. Or perhaps you are a fan of poetry? Look no further, then, than the Psalms, speaking as they do of every human emotion, condition and situation and the wonder and presence of God. It may be that you want some sound advice and guidance? The Book of Proverbs can furnish you with pithy saying after pithy saying, so here's one to whet your appetite, 'Better is a dinner of vegetables where love is than a fatted ox and hatred with it' (Proverbs 15: 17). Or perhaps something a little more racy? Don't forget about the Song of Solomon and its heights of romantic, even erotic poetic fancy. And none of this even mentions the New Testament (why not read a whole Gospel through as they are designed to be read?)

So, there is more than we sometimes realise in the Scriptures. And just as some people are part of a Book Club where you can share your understanding, it may be that at some point you have questions about parts of the Bible. If this is so, in the autumn we have a Pilgrim Bible Course to help address this. Whatever you might be reading this summer, may it bring rest, quietness, trust and strength!
