### **Letter from The Vicar**

I am afraid, brothers and sisters, that I did not make it through Election Night after all (opting for sleep before a friend's wedding in Gloucestershire that weekend), so it was a bit like the EU Referendum and then Mr Trump, waking up the following morning, having missed all the excitement! We have had to learn or re-learn terms like "hung parliament", although saying anything about politics and the nation at the moment feels very risky as things seem much more uncertain and we worry for what is around the corner.

In fact, more to the point, I think all of Manchester, London Bridge and the fire in West London have happened since I last wrote (God forbid there may be more in the days following). These are of course not all related and one should be careful about drawing conclusions. The main conclusion is our thoughts and prayers and bleeding hearts for all those who have died, who are traumatised, who mourn and most believers in God would want to stress His compassion and pity for all in pain and the wideness of His mercy through the gates of heaven.

But, to tentatively say a little more, these are distressing events and potentially worrying times. As others have said, however, even in the darkness there have been countless acts of light and much rallying round. We must all hold on to that and try to

emulate it. I do wonder whether the rather negative "hung" parliament – horrid connotations with hanging (or that would be "hanged") or more likely not being able to get anything done – could be construed as a more positive opportunity. Some disillusionment with politics and politicians lies in their seemingly endless bickering, jostling, and one-upmanship. I think by contrast of this lovely verse at the start of Psalm 133:

'Behold how good and pleasant it is to dwell together in unity.'

Now, I confess that the Church doesn't always practise what it preaches here. Think of Roman Catholics, Protestants, Orthodox, Anglicans, Methodists, Baptists, Pentecostals and so on and so on (not forgetting heated disagreements within these bodies)! When the Holy Spirit was given at Pentecost, He brought the nations and their languages back together again (which had been divided at the Tower of Babel). I hope sincerely that Christians haven't given up on this vocation of unity; that they are still trying to be one. And so I hope that MPs and parliament might have a similar vocation in these days as I also hope that all of us in Pagham do too for the local issues with which we contend. Psalm 133 concludes with this implied consequence of unity: 'For there the Lord has promised his

blessing: even life for evermore.'
