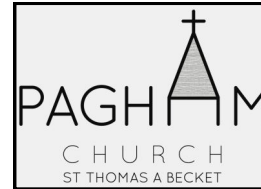

Raise the Roof Appeal
St Thomas à Becket Church Pagham wins
National Lottery support

This summer St Thomas à Becket Church has received a National Lottery grant of up to £100,000 for an exciting heritage project, restoring the roof of our Grade 1 listed Church in Pagham. Made possible by money raised by National Lottery players, the project will enable the heritage of the building and all contained within it to be preserved for future generations. We plan to start the work in Spring 2019 and the church will remain open and accessible throughout the project. Supported through the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF), the project will enable local people to learn more about their history through new guidebooks, leaflets and website content. There will also be an exhibition of the Restoration Project for the benefit of local schools, Uniformed Groups, local history societies and others. St Thomas à Becket Church has been in Pagham for over 800 years, thereby preserving many memories and artefacts for its community. Commenting on the award, Michael Wake project co-ordinator, said: "We are delighted to receive this support and are

really grateful to, and thankful for, all those who play the National Lottery which makes these awards possible. We are confident that with this support we will be able to complete our project so that we can continue to serve our parish and community, allowing all to enjoy their heritage."

Michelle Roffe, Head of HLF South East said: "We are delighted to support Pagham PCC to preserve and share the heritage of this important church. Thanks to National Lottery players, this vital local building will be saved and brought to life for current and future generations".

As your vicar, I add my thanks to those of you in the community who have given in various and generous ways to the Roof Fund. Without you we wouldn't be in a position to start next spring. We do also still need further funds and one such way to contribute is at next month's Story of Pagham Weddings Event. This will be a fascinating and personal journey through weddings past, highlighting again how important our beloved church is for weddings present and future, as well as other life events. I feel like singing with the angels: "Glory to God in the highest and peace to his people on earth!"
