Letter from the Vicar

I seem to be on the beach a lot these days, chiefly thanks to having a dog! At the very beginning of this month, we will have had the AGM of the Pagham Flood Defence Trust in the Yacht Club: an appropriate and a beautiful setting, especially in these summer months (though some of June has been quite wild enough!) And now just outside the Yacht Club, there is the restored and re-dedicated memorial to the Mulberry Harbours and Pagham's role in D-Day; do go and have a look at it, and be thankful. It is to be hoped that it will be a further sign and safeguard of our beach and village... I am no doubt pondering the sea as we prepare to move inland. I wonder, where do we all sit with the sea? One might assume we are all there all the time; that's why we live here? Yet (confession time) I did not get down to the beach half as much before we had our Labrador Murphy and I reckon it's potentially quite easy to forget about the sea unless one lives right on it. This month (14 July) we are keeping Sea Sunday and remembering the Mission to Seafarers and all whose lives and livelihoods are connected to the sea. In Pagham, we know both its calm and beauty, but also its power and capacity to wreak havoc. The Book of Common Prayer contains some

sobering material under Forms of Prayer to be Used at Sea with sentiments such as these: 'save, Lord, or else we perish. The living, the living shall praise thee. O send thy word of command to rebuke the raging winds, and the roaring sea.' Many have cried out – and still cry – faced with nature's power and the peril of the storm. Perhaps as well the sea appeals because of this range and how it can map on to the range of our moods. Our annual Art Exhibition usually has several fine offerings of sea-scapes (including our own), which is a nice substitute for those whose vistas do not spread out onto the water, and a good prompt for reflection and contemplation.

In many ways, I rather like the wildness of our own beach. It means it isn't ever absolutely crowded, although it is well-used. It is our defence, so a big part of our identity, and maybe we're a bit wild in Pagham?! Are we not a little out on a limb? Do we not have something of an independent spirit? Do we not enjoy the good things of life (four pubs within a few hundred yards, after all)? Let us thank God for the sea: for all its moods and for its commentary on our own life's story.
