Be Touched by the Master's Hand

Some people have the gift of creativity. Perhaps the artist, transforming a blank canvas into a beautiful picture. The gardener, turning a barren piece of land into a beautiful landscape. The musician, using their instruments to create great sounds. The cabinet maker creating furniture which lasts a lifetime. People who turn the ordinary into the extraordinary.

There is an incident in the Bible when Jesus turned the ordinary into the extraordinary. Jesus was at a wedding feast when the wine ran out. Jesus' mother Mary told Him this, so Jesus told his servants to fill some large jars with water and Jesus turned the water into wine. Jesus replaced the ordinary with the extraordinary. This was a sign of Jesus' divine power and a revealing of His glory. Jesus transformed the situation at that wedding feast and can transform our lives also. God cares about us and about the details of our lives.

Myra Brooks Welch lived in the USA and as a child she loved playing the organ. But she later suffered badly from arthritis and spent much time in a wheelchair. Though it was painful for her, she loved writing and said the joy of her writing outweighed the pain of her efforts. She was known as 'The poet with the singing soul' and in 1921 wrote 'The Touch of the Master's Hand'.

Twas battered and scarred, and the auctioneer thought it scarcely worth his while to waste much time on the old violin, but held it up with a smile:

'What am I bidden, good folks,' he cried, 'Who'll start the bidding for me?' 'A dollar, a dollar', then, 'two!' 'Only two'? Two dollars, and who'll make it three?

Three dollars, once; three dollars, twice; Going for three ---'But no,

From the room, far back, a grey haired man came forward and picked up the bow;
Then, wiping the dust from the old violin, and tightening the loose strings,
He played a melody pure and sweet as a

carolling angel sings.

The music ceased, and the auctioneer, with a voice that was quiet and low,

Said: 'What am I bid for the old violin?' And he held it up with the bow.

'A thousand dollars, and who'll make it two? Two thousand! and who'll make it three? Three thousand, once, three thousand twice, and going, and gone,' said he.

The people cheered, but some of them cried, 'We do not quite understand what changed its worth'. Swift came the reply: 'The touch of the Master's hand.'

And many a man with life out of tune, and battered and scarred with sin, is auctioned cheap to the thoughtless crowd, much like the old violin.

'A mess of pottage', a glass of wine; a game - and he travels on.

He is 'going' once, and 'going' twice, He's 'going' and almost 'gone'.

But the Master comes, and the foolish crowd never quite understand

The worth of a soul and the change that's wrought by the touch of the Master's hand.

In those times in our lives, when problems and troubles come our way, when we feel as though 'the wine has run out', remember this sign of Jesus turning water into wine, trust Him, and be touched by the Master's hand.
