We are invited to put a lit candle (safely) in a window of our home, at 8pm. These prayers can be used at that time, or at any other time that feels appropriate.

We place our candle(s) in front of us, and as we light them, we say:

As we think about all that has changed this year, help us to trust that you are always with us. As we remember those who have died, help us to trust they are at peace with you. As we reach out to others with kindness and care, may hope shine out in every heart and home. Amen

## Readings

One or more of the following Scripture passages is read.

Thus says the LORD of hosts:

Consider, and call for the mourning women to come; send for the skilled women to come; let them quickly raise a dirge over us, so that our eyes may run down with tears,

and our eyelids flow with water.

For a sound of wailing is heard from Zion:

"How we are ruined!

We are utterly shamed, because we have left the land,

because they have cast down our dwellings." Hear, O women, the word of the LORD.

and let your ears receive the word of his mouth;

teach to your daughters a dirge,

and each to her neighbour a lament.

"Death has come up into our windows, it has entered our palaces,

to cut off the children from the streets and the young men from the squares."
